Dear Chairmen Frelinghuysen and Aderholt, and Ranking Members Lowey and Bishop:

On behalf of the undersigned organizations, we write in strong support of the Senate's Fiscal Year 2019 appropriation of \$67.5 million for the WIC Breastfeeding Peer Counselor program. This funding level represents a \$7.5 million, or approximately 15%, increase in funding for the program. Despite being a critical and effective breastfeeding support shown to increase the rate of both initiation^{1,ii} and durationⁱⁱⁱ of breastfeeding, the WIC breastfeeding peer counselor program does not receive adequate appropriations to reach all eligible WIC moms. As a result, an average of only 53% of pregnant and postpartum participants are enrolled in peer counseling.

With additional funding, we can ensure that more WIC moms are able to access this vital service. For moms like Kendra Bentley of North Carolina, the WIC breastfeeding peer counselor program can make the difference between continuing to breastfeed and having to give up when challenges arise. Kendra reports that the program helped her to meet her breastfeeding goals, despite initially low milk production as a result of previous breast surgery, and her daughter being born with a tongue tie. "I would not be the breastfeeding mama and donor milk advocate I am today without the support WIC provided to me during the most challenging time in my life," says Kendra.

Moms and babies like Kendra and her daughter, Charlotte, are counting on you to support this important public health program. We ask you to maintain the Senate funding level of \$67.5 million for the WIC Breastfeeding Peer Counselor program in your FY 2019 Agriculture Appropriations bill.
