

ATOD Student Poster Award Criteria

1. Innovation and Importance: what is new, creative, ground-breaking about the project?
2. How important is the work for ATOD and/or public health in general? Project Design and Implementation: quality and level of detail and fit of methods with the project aims. How was the project conducted to achieve its goals?
3. Implications and Generalizability: How well are implications for practice or policy discussed? Are results broad enough to change the way the field thinks or acts?
4. Quality of Communication—is the poster well organized, graphically interesting, appealing to the eye, self explanatory and clearly presented?
5. During the session, is the presenter able to supplement the poster with a brief and clear presentation in person?
6. Overall Rating: is the whole greater or lesser than its component parts (above)?
