July 2022	APHA staff will develop a list of current policy statement gaps. These gaps generally reflect current or emergent public health issues that fall under the association's overarching priorities and for which the association does not have a current, up-to-date policy statement. Policy statement gaps will be posted on APHA's website featured in Inside Public Health.

February 13	Proposed policy statements for the 2023 cycle are due
February 21	Proposed policy statements are posted on APHA's website for APHA member review.
March 21	Member comments on proposed policy statements are due
Late April	APHA's Science Board and Joint Policy Committee meet to review proposed policy statements and member comments.
May 26	Deadline for JPC to send letters via email to authors of proposed policy statements with comments and assessments.
June 9	Deadline for authors who receive a "negative" assessment to notify the JPC that they are NOT withdrawing their proposal and wish to move it forward in the process. An email notification must be sent to policy@apha.org by 11:59 p.m. (ET).
August 24	Revised proposed policy statements based on JPC comments are due
September 11	APHA's Executive Board considers any appeals of the JPC's assessments of proposed policy statements.
Late September	JPC holds a conference call to discuss status of proposals that were August 24 deadline. Authors are notified of the JPC's second assessment post-call via email.
Early October	Revised drafts of proposed policy statements as well as comments from the JPC, Science Board, and the authors' responses, if any, will be posted on APHA's website.
October 20	<u>Late-breaking new policy statements</u> are due by 11:59 p.m. (ET). No exceptions will be made.
October 23	Optional second revisions based on JPC's second assessment due
November 1 and 2	Public hearings for proposed policy statements (via webinar)
November 12	The JPC develops final recommendations for proposed policy statements to present to the Governing Council.
November 14	The Governing Council considers the JPC's recommendations on proposed policy statements and votes on the consent agenda.
