



#### **2022 Proposed Policy Statements**

19 proposed policy statements received and reviewed in the 2022 cycle, including 2 resubmitted late-breakers from 2021.

4 overarching areas; Economics and International Health, Environment and Human Rights, Law, Violence Prevention and Equity, and Access to Care, Equity and Prevention



#### **Spring Science Board and JPC Reviews**

- Science Board conducted their first review of the proposed policy statements 4/20-4/21 and JPC held their review 4/28-4/29.
- 8 proposed policy statements received conditional assessments and 11 received negative assessments
- Assessments and comments were provided to authors on May 20
- The full Science Board and JPC assessments with comments are available on the web. Governing Councilors should review and contact authors with questions/suggestions as they embark on their revisions



#### **Next Steps**

- Resubmission of proposed policy statements are due August 15
- JPC will review the resubmissions and provide a second assessment in mid-September
- Late Breaker submissions are due to <a href="mailto:policy@apha.org">policy@apha.org</a> by October 17<sup>th</sup>
- Public Hearings will be virtual ahead of the Annual Meeting on November 1&2 (time TBD)
- GC will discuss and vote on the proposed policy statements at the Annual Meeting during Session II on Tuesday, November 8<sup>th</sup>.

#### Archiving

- 13 policy statements adopted in 2002 are up for archiving this year. The list of statements is available on the website under policy statements/archiving
- The deadline for requests to keep statements active has been extended to June 30<sup>th</sup>. A rationale for keeping the policy statement active and removing it from the consent agenda for archiving must accompany the request and should be sent to <u>policy@apha.org</u>
- Science Board will review these request and make recommendations to the JPC
- While archived statements no longer guide APHA policy or practice, they remain available to members as historical documents. APHA members are encouraged to update policy statements scheduled for archiving with the latest evidence and rationale in support of priority policy areas. However, policy statements can also be updated by any APHA member following archiving.

## Recommendation re: archiving of policy statements adopted in 2021 related to the COVID 19 pandemic



#### **2021 Motion re: COVID policy statements**

- October 2021- JPC motioned that the Governing Council archive the three statements below after 3 years vs. the standard 10 years given the rapidly evolving evidence and experience in the pandemic in order to ensure the science, evidence and action steps remain up to date.
  - 2021-11 Lessons Learned from the COVID-19 Pandemic: The Importance of Universal Healthcare in Addressing Healthcare Inequities
  - 2021-18 Preparing Public Schools in the United States for the Next Public Health Emergency: Lessons Learned from COVID-19
  - 2021-08 Call for Urgent Actions to Address Health Inequities in the U.S. Coronavirus Disease 2019 Pandemic and Response-
- Following debate, the Council moved to suspend consideration of the motion at the October 2021 meeting and revisit the recommendation at the June 2022 meeting.



#### **New motion**

- JPC recognizes the possible need for narrow, targeting policy statements when dealing with emergent public health problem, but rapidly evolving evidence bases support more frequent updating of these statements. Therefore, in addition to consideration of early archiving, the yearly gaps in policy statements APHA will identify policy statements that were originally written with a narrow scope that would benefit from an update with a broader lens.
- The 2022 JPC revisited the three policy statements recommended for archiving after three years and found that 2021-11 and 2021-18 address pandemics broadly with evidence and action steps that are likely to remain relevant in years to come. JPC recommends these statement be archived after 10 years as is standard practice.
- 2021-08- Call for Urgent Actions to Address Health Inequities in the U.S. Coronavirus
   Disease 2019 Pandemic and Response- is largely specific to the COVID-19 pandemic and
   requires more frequent updating of the evidence base and action steps to reflect current science
   and environment and appropriately guide APHA policy and practice.
  - Motion: JPC moves that policy statement 2021-08 be archived in 2024 (3 years from adoption)

#### Progress to date towards replacing APHA Connect with APHA LEAD

- 1. Higher Logic selected and new APHA LEAD platform set to launch this summer
  - 1. Migrate data from APHA Connect
  - 2. Integrate with IMIS
  - 3. Create seed content for new "communities" (each APHA unit to have a community)
  - 4. Conduct beta testing
  - 5. Train staff and leaders
    - **1. Community Admins Invited to Training on June 15, 2022 at 2PM ET-** In this webinar for section leaders, registrants will learn how to use the new APHA LEAD platform to increase engagement among section members
  - 6. Prepare mobile app
- 2. Communications committee formed to focus on the launch
- 3. Hired new staff member, Sebastian Padrino, to help manage new platform



#### **Features of APHA LEAD**

APHA LEAD has:

- User-friendly functionality and layout,
- A mobile app, making it easier to connect and join the discussion,
- The ability to sign up for APHA activities through a **streamlined events** calendar
- A mentoring and volunteer module (Phase 2)
- A new expert directory, making it easier than ever to network. (Phase 2)



#### **Committee 1: Mentoring**

Objectives:

- 1. Develop a comprehensive approach to connecting members with mentors
- 2. Offer more speed mentoring programs throughout the year



#### **New Distinguished Leaders Mentoring Series**

#### Additional upcoming mentoring initiatives

- 1. Cohort-style mentoring- creates a longer-term relationship, both with the mentor and peers, and more learning. Focus on a particular topic of interest or skill
- 2. Speed mentoring
- 3. Traditional 1:1 mentoring- Mentoring Match within APHA LEAD launching in late summer/fall



#### **Committee 3: Onboarding New Members**

Objectives:

- 1. Have a specific staff position established to direct and guide new members
- 2. Create a structured process to onboard new members focusing on navigating APHA and getting value out of their membership
- 3. Ensure information on each unit and its strategic goals, activities and ways to get involved are available to all members



#### New member webinar redesign and survey launch

- Newly designed membership webinar to be held quarterly designed to help new members get engaged quickly! (More experienced members are welcome, too).

#### **Committee 5 and Overall Project Management**

- Committee 5, Measurement and Rewards, was set to launch after the strategic plan to align metrics with strategy. Since strategic planning has been delayed, Brighter Strategies will, depending on budget, provide the following service:
  - Identify best practices for gamification using Higher Logic together with committee 5.
  - Conduct pre-strategic planning activities (mining their data for comments relevant to strategy to inform the firm selected to conduct strategic planning).
  - Continue supporting the other 4 committees to execute their goals.

- Committees 1-4 will continue to meet and work to complete tasks through early 2023
- 2023 Staff prioritization and implementation planning for the next set of recommendations

#### **Current APHA Strategic Plan**

- 5+ years old
- Outward focus
  - Strategic plan for public health, not APHA
- Progress measured by changes in Leading Health Indicators
  - Slow to change
  - Hard to evaluate impact of activities
  - Hard to find leverage points to impact these
- Strategic Portfolios have provided a flexible framework

#### **Executive Board adopted Committee recommendations**:

- Begin work on new strategic plan for APHA
  - Focus on strengthening APHA
  - Focus on metrics to measure progress and inform changes
  - Ensure solid evaluation plan and timetable
- Keep strategic portfolios
- Build on what we learned from APHA Your Way project
- Hire consultant
  - Gather input from affiliates, caucuses, staff, members
  - Facilitate developing new strategic plan

- June: EB approve budget for consultant
- July-August: develop and issue RFP
- Sept-Oct: review proposals and select consultant
- Nov-May:
  - Gather input
  - Draft and circulate proposed new plan
- Governing Council Mid-Year Meeting 2023 approve new plan




### **NPHW 2022**



## Addressing Challenges to Public Health Authority

RWJF initiative to protect public health from state legislative challenges to public health authority

- Collaboration with Local Solutions Support Center (lead) and ChangeLab Solutions with public health law consortium.
- APHA's role
  - Educating and mobilizing the national public health community, including APHA leadership, state affiliates, caucuses, past presidents
  - Mobilizing partners outside of public health (e.g., healthcare, business, education)
  - Providing financial and technical support to help mobilize APHA affiliates in priority states (6-10 states)
  - Utilizing methods: town halls with multisectoral partners, webinars, trainings, strategic communications, social media, conference sessions


