
HOW CLIMATE CHANGE AFFECTS YOUR HEALTH

TEMPERATURES

Summer of 2023 was Earth's hottest since global records began in 1880.1

Urban neighborhoods can be up to **20 degrees hotter** than outlying areas with more trees and less pavement. This is called the Urban Heat Island Effect.²



At least 425
people are estimated to have died from heat-related causes between May and October 2023 in Maricopa County, AZ.3
