## 2025 Council of Affiliates Innovation in Public Health Award

**Brett Harris** is faculty at University at Albany, State University of New York in the Department of Health Policy, Management and Behavior. Her work has focused on substance use and suicide prevention. Her public health practice experience has focused on behavioral health.

Brett founded the New York State Public Health Association Mental Health Workgroup. She led the development of a Mental Health Webinar Series with 14 sessions to be delivered throughout the year. This webinar series has brought in sponsorships and led to increased collaborations between public health and mental health organizations such as American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (AFSP) and the New York State Office of Mental Health.

Brett led the formation of the Behavioral Health Advisory Group to raise awareness of the New York State Public Health Association among behavioral health organizations, better understand priorities and build partnerships to improve behavioral health.

Brett aligns with APHA through her work with the ISC on suicide prevention and the mental health section.

## Advocating

- Invested in VoterVoice in 2024 and have successfully advanced four statewide campaigns focused on tobacco prevention and Medicaid, resulting in more than 230 messages delivered to legislators.
- Proceeding NPHW, NCPHA hosted its first Public Health Day at the NC General Assembly and convened 50+ members to advocate for tobacco 21 legislation and local public health communicable disease funding. Met in person with 30 senators and 30 representatives
- NCPHA Advocacy Committee consulted with Sections to determine where to prioritize efforts leading to a more refined and strategic approach
- Donated to APHA in a more substantial way than previous to advance APHA's role in public health

## **Educating**

- Fall 2024 conference was the largest event to date with more than 600 members attending
- Hosted in partnership with the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians and piloted a scholarship program offering 5 attendees registration
- · Hosted a Public Health Data Summit focused on innovations in public health data

## Advancing

- After Hurricane Helene, NCPHA launched a Disaster Relief Fund to support public health professionals affected by the storm; the fund is now a permanent fund to support future disasters.
- As a Smart Surfaces grant recipient, NCPHA is working closely with City of Charlotte and local partners to raise awareness about the intersection of climate and health and the potential of Smart Surfaces.

**Arielle Hieronimus**, an epidemiologist by training joined the Ohio Public Health Association to lead the growth of the Public Health Professional Services (PHPS) program. The program was conceived to build a funding stream for OPHA and help meet the growing and diverse staffing needs of public health agencies across the state by placing qualified professionals in part-time, temporary or short term roles filling critical staffing gaps. Arielle's leadership has grown the program to include hundreds of experts in a variety of areas to contribute more than 3000 hours to agencies across Ohio in 2024. She monitors job trends, recruits and aligns her work with OPHA's mission to strengthen the public health workforce.

Arielle's efforts have generated revenue to cover her position and supported other non-revenue generating programs within OPHA. This contributed to the financial health and mission-driven sustainability of OPHA. Her leadership led to the development of OPHA's profession-based listserv communities and these communities serve as vital platforms for members to exchange resources, ask questions, learn about training opportunities and connect with peers.
