PUBLIC HEALTH FUNDING Strong investments in public health allow a state to carry out programs that improve health. Maine receives \$157 per person total from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and Prevention and the Health Resources Services Administration (HRSA) in public health funding. In fiscal year 2023, the Prevention and Public Health Fund awarded the state over \$4.54 million in grants for community and clinical prevention efforts and improvements to public health infrastructure.

ACCESS TO CARE 5.9 percent of people in Maine do not have health insurance coverage compared to the national uninsured rate of 7.9 percent. The number of practicing primary care providers is also an important measure of health care availability. Maine has 379.5 active primary care providers per 100,000 people, ranking 2nd highest in the nation.

Notable Health Measures

- **High school graduation** 86.1 percent of students graduate from high school in Maine, ranking the state 28th highest in the nation. This is a notable measure as there is a strong connection between education and health. People with higher levels of education are more likely to adopt healthy behaviors.
- **Homicide** Maine reported 1.9 homicides per 100,000 population,, second lowest in the nation.
- **Air pollution** The state reports 5.2 micrograms of fine particles per cubic meter, ranking the state 4th lowest in air pollution in the nation. Poor air quality leads to reduced lung function, risk of asthma complications, heart attacks, heart failure, and death, and particularly impacts young children and older adults.

The Challenges Ahead

- **Tobacco use** 14.0 percent of adults reported smoking regularly in Maine, compared to the national average of 12.1 percent.
- **Drug deaths** Maine had a drug-related death rate of 51.0 drug deaths per 100,000 population in 2022, ranking the state 5th highest for drug deaths in the nation.
- **Asthma** Maine has the second highest rate of asthma in the nation, with 12.9 percent of adults diagnosed with asthma in 2023.
