- 3) Ensure a qualified environmental health workforce

Flint Water Crisis

Opportunities for Action

- Stronger enforcement of the Safe Drinking Water Act's Lead Copper Rule
- Improve surveillance capabilities to prevent, detect and monitor exposures
- Develop a federal interagency plan to eliminate lead exposure



Case Example

Hurricane Katrina and Super Storm Sandy



In August of 2005, Hurricane Katrina flooded the city of New Orleans, Louisiana, damaging or destroying over 100,000 homes, and causing \$108 billion in damage.

- Promote clean air for all
- 2) Improve surveillance capabilities to prevent, detect and monitor large-scale exposures
